MINISTRY OVERVIEW

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada | Immigration, Réfugiés et Citoyenneté Canada funded the LINC (Language Instruction for Newcomers to Canada) classes.

This year we averaged 379 returning student registrations and 173 new students for a total of 552 students in our continuous LINC Program. We offer three semesters each year of English Language training for students from around the globe desiring to learn English. We partner with ILVARC (Immigrant Language and Vocational Assessment and Referral Centre) to refer the LINC students. A semester at Agape Language Centre lasts 15 weeks.

Through additional funding from IRCC this year we were able to offer classes to the Syrian Refugees. During 2016 Agape introduced 6 additional classes to the already 10 classes provided for clients providing a total of 16 LINC classes ranging from Literacy to CLB 5 every Monday to Friday mornings, afternoons and Tuesday and Thursday Evenings.

Agape Language Centre is honoured that we had the opportunity of meeting the needs of our new neighbours who have traveled from Syria, China, Egypt, Pakistan, Afghanistan, United Arab Emirates, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iraq, Lebanon, Venezuela, and Columbia in 2017.

<u>Special events</u> are part of the learning experience that students have come to expect when attending Agape Language Centre. The events are planned primarily to help students become more familiar with Canadian culture while they learn English.

<u>Guest speakers</u> are also an important part of the student learning experience. Agape invited guest speakers to the school each semester to present to the students and provide them with an opportunity to connect with important resources for their settlements. Depending on the guest all the classes may be combined, or group by levels. Agape provides a display of current settlement resources for the students.

<u>Field Trips</u> help students interact within the non-immigrant community here in Calgary. Some of the trips or activities were to: Library, Aggie Days, Calgary Stampede, GlenBow park

Agape Language Centre recognizes the importance of networking with other organizations and to keep abreast of government updates within the LINC Program. Throughout the year I attended LINC Co-ordinators and the ILCVARC Advisory Committee meetings. These meetings were very informative as changes to LINC programs and updates were often discussed.
